



Cross gable roof

Pitch: The steepness of a roof

Gable roof: A pitched roof with two sloped sides. This is the typical roof that we think

of when we draw a house. They can be very low pitched or very high

pitched.

Hip roof: A roof with 4 sloped sides

Gambrel roof: A roof that has two slopes on each side, the upper slope being flatter than

the lower slope, allowing interior space for full sized room upstairs.

Mansard roof: a roof that has two slopes on all sides, with the lower slope being steep

and the upper slope being almost flat

Flat roof: a single plane roof that is pitched at a very low angle to shed water

Shed roof: A roof that starts at the eaves of the existing roof and continues at a lower

pitch.

Cross Gable roof: A pair of gable roofs set at right angles to each other.
